Lake Agnes Teahouse

Distance 6.8 km return

Elevation Gain 385 m

Time Required 2.5 - 3 hours
Difficulty Moderate

Trailhead Château Lake Louise



The hike to Lake Agnes and the historic teahouse on its shores is a relatively easy hike through forest. A beautiful waterfall flows out of Lake Agnes just below the teahouse, where you can enjoy a cup of tea and fresh piece of pie. Continue 1.6 km around the far end of Lake Agnes and up switchbacks to the shelter at the top of the Big Beehive for views of the Bow Valley and Lake Louise

By far one of the most scenic hikes in the Canadian Rockies, the Plain of Six Glaciers trail offers expansive views of the impressive mountain features that surround Lake Louise, including Mt. Lefroy, Mt. Victoria and the Victoria Glacier. After your steady hike up, enjoy a snack at the historic Plain of Six Glaciers Teahouse before continuing 1 kilometer to talus slopes that provide a high viewpoint of Abbot Pass.

Bow River Loop

Distance 7.1 km return

Elevation Gain 0 m
Time Required 2 hours
Difficulty Easy

Trailhead Lake Louise Train Station parking lot.

Travel on a pleasant trail in the rich riparian zone of the Bow River. These waters travel across the prairies to their ultimate destination in Hudson Bay, over 2500 kilometers downstream of Lake Louise. Interpretive trail.

Tramline

Trailhead Lake Louise Station parking lot.

Follow in the footsteps - or trolley wheels - of travelers who, a century ago, were dropped off at the railway station and then ferried, by tram, on this 3% railway grade to the Chateau Lake Louise.

Lake Louise Lakeshore

Distance 2 km one way

Elevation Gain 0 m
Time Required 1 hour
Difficulty Easy

Trailhead Upper Lake Louise Parking Area

This accessible stroll allows visitors of all abilities to explore Lake Louise. At the end of the lake you'll discover the milky creek that gives the lake its magical color.



Moraine Lake Shoreline / Rock Pile

Distance 3 km return

Elevation Gain 0 m
Time Required 45 min
Difficulty Easy

Trailhead Moraine Lake Parking Lot

The hike around the Moraine Lake Shoreline is the easiest way to appreciate the beauty of this famous alpine lake. A flat, easy trail weaves its way through shoreline trees and offers extraordinary views of the Ten Peaks, a series of encircling summits all over 10,000 feet. Hike up the Rock Pile for an alternative view of these turquoise waters and the nearby Tower of Babel.

Consolation Lakes

Distance 2.9 km one way

Elevation Gain 65 m
Time Required 2 hours
Difficulty Easy

Trailhead Moraine Lake Parking Lot

Hiking to Consolation Lakes requires much less effort than most of the Moraine Lake trails, but rewards the hiker with views of high alpine meadows, enormous talus slopes and the Quadra Glacier.

During the fall experience the picturesque colors of the larch trees and learn about the survival strategies of the larches in the harsh alpine environment.

Destination Lakehead Ride

Departure times: 9:30 am, 10:30 am, 1:30 pm & 3:00 pm

The Destination ride travels along the northwest edge of the Lake through a century old subalpine forest of spruce and fir trees. As you travel to the end of the Lake, Mount Fairview can be seen to the east, with Mount Victoria to the south. The emerald color of the Lake can be seen through the trees as your ride progresses. At the end of the Lake, the final destination, you can look back to view the Chateau Lake Louise and have the opportunity for breathtaking photos.

Lake Agnes Tea House Half-Day Ride

Departure times: 9:00 am and 1:00 pm

Known as one of the most popular trails in the Canadian Rockies, the Lake Agnes teahouse ride will climb to an elevation of 7000 feet to a tarn nestled in a valley high above Lake Louise. This historic mountain teahouse, named after the wife of Canada's first Prime Minister, was originally built in 1901, and rebuilt in 1981.



The trail follows along the tree line of Lake Louise through a large growth of sub-alpine forest rich with Spruce and Fir trees. You will see Lake Louise below and the lower level of Fairview Mountain. As the trail climbs steadily to your teahouse destination you will soon view the base of Big Beehive Mountain and Mirror Lake. Mirror Lake is often referred to as "the goat's looking glass" as mountain goats till populate this area.

Climbing above Mirror Lake, the massive peaks of Mount St. Piran, Mount Aberdeen and the glacial peaks of Mount Temple will all come into view. Mount Temple is the third highest peak in Banff National Park, at 3544 m/ 11,500 feet high.

Plain of Six Glaciers Tea House Ride

Departure time: 1:00 pm

The mountain trail ride to the Plain of Six Glaciers is a continuation of the trail that takes you to the end of Lake Louise. You travel to the base of Victoria Glacier where you can view numerous breathtaking glacial fields as well as Mount Victoria.

The trail travels beneath spectacular rock faces, and through sub-alpine forest, and across large avalanche paths along the slopes of Mount Whyte. You next travel to a viewpoint where the 'Plain' can be observed. This is a long glacier at the base of the lower Victoria Glacier.

From horseback you will view six other glaciers: Lower Victoria, Upper Victoria, Aberdeen, Lefroy, Upper Lefroy, and Popes. The splendor that is Lake Louise was created by the flow of these glaciers millions of years ago.

Traveling the last leg of your trip your guide will take you to the Plain of Six Glaciers Teahouse, built in 1924, at 7000 feet as a base for Swiss Guide mountaineers. This trail gives you grand views of Lake Louise and the lower valley floor as you descend in elevation.

Full Day Expedition Ride

Paradise Valley, Giant Steps, Lake Annette and the Horseshoe and Glacier Departure times: 9:00 am (Full Day Ride)

The all-day ride to Paradise departs Brewster Lake Louise Stables at 9:00 am and travels along the east side of Mount Fairview.

You ride through alpine forest and gradually climb through a tree line forest of Larch. Larch trees grow only at tree line and normally only about 7000 feet. The needles on these trees turn a golden yellow in the fall or late summer. As we approach Temple Mountain we turn on to the trail to Lake Annette where we have our lunch stop. We continue on the High Line Trail going by the Giant Steps Waterfall.

Once your guide takes you up above tree line you will have a spectacular view of the massive Wenkchemna Peaks, or the "Valley of Ten Peaks". Wenkchemna is a Stoney First Nation word that means 'ten'.

The high alpine meadows you traverse are filled with mountain wild flowers as well as a small group of little lakes called Minnestimma Lakes, another Stoney word that refers to "sleeping waters".

This is an amazing high alpine ride, and a special place in the Canadian Rockies.



Lake Louise

Emerald Lake

Emerald Lake is the largest lake located in Yoho National Park in the province of British Columbia. It is a 20 minute



drive west from Lake Louise. With a beautiful green hue it truly stands up to it's name. The color is most intense in early summer when there is a high amount of glacial silt flowing from the surrounding mountains. Due to the high elevation of the lake it remains frozen from November to early June.

Opening hours: June - 10am-6pm, July & August - 9am-7pm, September until Thanksgiving - 10am-6pm

Moraine Lake

Moraine Lake is only half the size of its nearby neighbor Lake Louise, but perhaps even more scenic. It's situated in the beautiful Valley Of The Ten Peaks in Banff National Park. This glacier-fed lake becomes the most intense and vivid shade of

turquoise blue. The setting of the surrounding majestic mountain peaks makes the scene almost surreal.

The canoes available can accommodate two or three people. They can't be reserved, the availability is on a first come, first served basis and guests of the Moraine Lake Lodge take priority. The operation of the canoe dock is weather dependent and subject to being closed without notice.

Closed till lake melts, please refer to front desk if needed

Hours: 9am – 5pm (last canoes leaves at 4pm), mid-June until mid-September

Johnston Canyon & Ink Pots

Your adventure begins with your choice of an easy 20 minute stroll to the lower falls at Johnston Canyon or 45 minutes to the upper falls at one of the most spectacular discoveries in Banff National Park. Your scenic trail is well

groomed and winds its way through Johnston Canyon towards seven sets of waterfalls. The lower falls are an easy 1.1K walk, the second set of falls are 2.7K. To the ink pots it is a total of 6 km one way.

To get there

The eastern section of the Bow Valley Parkway from the junction of the Bow Valley Parkway and Highway 93 South to Fireside day-use area will continue to be closed throughout the summer to public vehicles. 


Golf - Banff Springs
